New Planting Watering Guide

Thank you for choosing Werbrich's Landscaping. Correct watering during the first year is very important for the establishment and growth of your new plantings. Even though we will be watering as needed during your project there will come a time when that responsibility will be handed off to you. Although we provide a "Plant Warranty" on all plantings the "Plant Warranty" does not apply if plants die from lack of water.

How Often and How Much Do I Water?

Although the chart offers general guidelines the frequency of watering new plantings can vary due to factors such as seasonal temperatures and soil conditions. Rainfall affects frequency as well but only if it is a heavy rain of ½" or more and on the specific area. *Any site or seasonal specific instructions will be discussed with you upon installation or final walk thru. Call us with any questions you may have.*

Note: Target the use of this chart to the season in which the plantings were installed. The times & frequency are guidelines. Proper watering is particularly important for the first 90-120 days. Remember to adjust frequency amount up or down depending on weather conditions and temperatures. It is better to provide a deep and thorough watering rather than frequent light watering.

Watering Tools

We strongly recommend the use of a "watering wand" to facilitate proper watering of your new plantings. Every plant and planting area is different so adapt these guidelines to your particular circumstance. Remember that **severe under watering or over watering** is one of the fastest ways to kill or injure a newly installed plant. Should you have any questions please contact us.
